We've seen what corporate polluters can do to our communities.

On April 5, an explosion in West Virginia killed 29 miners. Two weeks later, an oil spill in the Gulf killed 11 workers, devastated the natural habitat, and resulted in the worst environmental disaster in our country's history.
